

## Share of US in the Overall Export Volume of Turkey





#### During 2000-2009 period;

- Overall Turkish export market has grown 268%.
- Share of US exports in the overall Turkish exports has decreased from 11.28% in 2000 down to 3.2% in 2009.



Just to keep the percentage share of the US in 2000 same,



the Turkish export to the US in 2009 has to be around 11 billion \$.



The US is an important market for Turkish exporters as it represents the largest import market in the world.
